

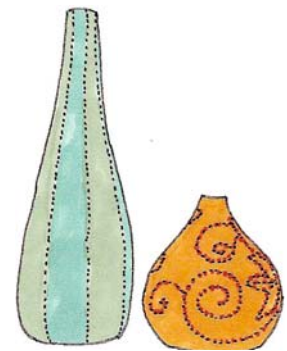

Accessory Décor

Accessories should reflect the colors, mood, and style of the room in addition to your personality. For visual interest, vary the texture of items – mix rattan with ceramic, highly polished and matte finishes, and so on. Accessories look better when grouped in odd numbers; collections have greater impact displayed together. One larger piece may be better than a few smaller ones. Try layering or stacking for added interest. Have fun with some of the accessory ideas below!

- Animal figurines
- Candlesticks of varying heights and styles
- Canvas totes, gardening hats & gloves
- Ceramic pieces
- Clocks
- Coasters
- Containers of shells, seaside finds, nautical accents, old fishing poles & tackle boxes
- Copper, iron, silver, bronze, or brass accent pieces
- Corbels with plants or other accents on top - or nothing on top
- Crystal décor
- Decanters & glasses
- Decorative bowls, plates, cups, teakettles, platters
- Distressed, hand-painted signs
- Earthenware
- Empty frames layered on walls or behind other accents on bookshelves



- Floor pots and containers for blankets, firewood, toys, newspapers
- Game boards placed on tables or mounted on walls
- Hatboxes, cake boxes, cigar boxes
- Large blocks – with or without lettering
- Leather carriers or suitcases
- Obelisks – mirrored, leather, wooden, metal
- Old clear or colored glass bottles
- Planters or urns
- Pots & pot racks
- Serving or tea trays
- Stacks of books
- Vases
- Vintage toys and tools
- Wicker baskets, rattan accents, wooden objects
